Since moving to Asia, David fell in love with Bali and has travelled there frequently for holidays. And his favourite villa in Bali is Atas Ombak. Naturally, the couple decided to tie their nuptials there. "Atas Ombak is classy and simple with a magnificent view. I always thought that this would be the perfect place to hold our wedding," David shares.

To assist them with their grand bridal bash, the couple engaged wedding consultant, Hannah Chong from Heaven's Gift. "I needed a wedding planner whom I could trust and communicate with. Chong's creations impressed me the most, and I love her work ethics too," says Joanne.





Preparations

While Atas Ombak had a spacious lawn that's great for the luxurious wedding, Chong still had to construct the entire setting for the event - 11 Mongolian tents with ambient lighting set around the shimmering pool that had a floating stage and dance floor.

Themed "Enchanted Bali," Chong took the couple's favourite colours of yellow, green, dark red and orange, and created a romantic setting that reflected both their personalities. "We only gave the wedding planner an idea of the things we liked and didn't like, and left the rest to her," says Joanne. To their delight, Chong coordinated all their wedding stationery, decorations and flower arrangements for the perfect set up - simple and elegant with a splash of colour.

Traditional Ceremony

On 28 March 2009, the day started Joanne's bridesmaids gatecrashing the villa and proceeded to have a wild time playing game and sabotaging David and his groomsmen. The Celebration

"The ceremony was a solemn one while the banquet was a big party for everyone to celebrate the occasion with us," says David. With that in mind, Chong created three distinct areas on the lawn for the wedding.

There was a bamboo gazebo decorated with summery red and orange chiffon cloth for David and Joanne's solemnisation. "It looked out to the stunning sea and was very romantic," beams Joanne. There was also a cosy chill-out corner decked with beanbags, sofa beds, and red and orange cushions where guest could unwind and relax. And for the banquet area, the pool and tables were dressed with elegant orange and red flower arrangements.

When guests arrived, they wrote their wishes on little cards and hung on them on a towering wishing tree trimmed with crystal beads and colourful butterflies.

That evening, everyone enjoyed a delightful feast catered by Mosaic, one of 100 best tables in the world and David's favourite restaurant in Asia. Created by chef Chris Salans, the bridal menu had a combination of French cuisine and local flavours with each dish paired with a wine.














Fond Memories
